Our 'What's the Buzz?" parent/caregiver interviews conclude this afternoon and I would like to thank all of those who have taken the opportunity to attend these. These are a wonderful opportunity to discuss your child and share with their teacher important information that will assist them throughout the year. If you were not able to make a time, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher and make a time that is mutually suitable.

In the last round of Principals Collective bargaining, a Principal's Coaching and Wellness fund was included. This can be used for a variety of aspects around principal's leadership. On Tuesday, I am travelling to Auckland to visit schools and also attend a seminar on welcoming former refugee families to schools. At the school visits, I am going to see localised curriculum in action, including community connections, how this is implemented and reviewed, as well as seeing a rejuvenation project a kura has undertaken in their local environment. I know this will all be very beneficial for my mahi at our kura.

With my senior leadership team, I met with Kelly Macknight (Director) and Chelsea Rhyne-Slijkerman (Counsellor) to discuss the implementation of the Be Heard counselling services that they are providing to our kura. I feel extremely grateful that we have been able to get this free service at our school and know that this will make a huge difference for some of our tamariki. Please read through the information on page 4 of this newsletter.

We are seeing quite a bit of sickness in the school at the moment, and there are a number of children who are away with Covid also. Please continue to test for Covid, and if your child is positive, keep them home until returning a negative result, and they are also feeling a lot better in themselves. A reminder that if a child is vomiting or has diarrhoea, Public Health South rules for schools are that children stay at home until 48 hours from 'the last event'. Children struggle to learn when they are not well, so please do keep them home when they are not feeling 100%, and this also helps minimise the spread to other children and staff. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Be Heard Children's Counselling Trust is a charity that offers free one to one counselling to children in selected Dunedin primary and intermediate schools.

Chelsea will be coming to Grants Braes on Thursdays to provide a safe space for children with low to moderate difficulties to talk about their thoughts and feelings, and develop some frontline coping strategies. A referral form can be completed by the student, parent/caregiver or teacher, and after an initial meeting, if the child is accepted into the service, they will be offered several 30-45 minute sessions depending on their need. Be Heard's scope is to provide a safe space to talk, so if a child requires more significant support, they will be referred on to a more appropriate service.

All sessions are confidential and held in a dedicated room on school grounds. Any information that Be Heard receives is stored securely in Cliniko, a patient management system. The sessions are confidential between the child and counsellor but children will generally be given resources to take home to share with parents/caregivers so they can also receive support in their home environment. If there is any concern the child is in danger of harm, parents/caregivers and the school will be immediately notified.

The referral form is attached with this newsletter and parents can email these to chelsea@beheard.org.nz or give it to the class teacher to pass on.

If you would like, there are paper copies of the referral form in the office.





Knox Church Junior Choir

Does your child like to sing?

Who are we?

A choir of children from year 2 to year 9 who are interested in music, at Knox Church, 449 George Street, Dunedin. Knox welcomes people of all faiths as well as those of no faith.



What's it all about?

Knox Church is looking to grow our Junior Choir. The Knox Church Choir has a long history of supporting young musicians to develop their talents. We welcome new members as we start the year.

What will we be doing?

Singing training, rehearsing choir music, dressing up as a chorister, learning about music, exploring the church.

Junior choristers sing in church on one Sunday morning each month, usually the third Sunday. The rehearsal for this starts at 9.15 am and the service starts at 10 am. Junior choristers are welcome to join in any other week they want to.

The junior choristers work on a structured, internationally recognised education programme, Voice for Life, to earn badges and ribbons. Some also sit for Trinity College London grade examinations with many achieving outstanding results.

Our choristers have performed at the switching on of the Christmas tree lights in the Octagon, busked in George Street and sung with the RSA choir.

Choristers enjoy movie and pizza nights, storytelling at Matariki, and joining in with the Christmas pageant.
