Awesome weather, fantastic organisation, a great variety of stalls and activities, wonderful donations from our own school community and wider, along with many dedicated people, all contributed to our biennial School Fair raising over \$20,000 to be put towards new playground equipment for our Junior Playground.

Our Year 6 students had a wonderful time at their Camp held at Waihola in November, with many children trying activities for the first time! Even though the weather wasn't great for the duration of their time there, this didn't stop the children making some fabulous memories before they move on to different schools next year.



The Year 5 children enjoyed a fabulous week of extra special opportunities during this term. This included a walk from Mount Cargill down to Chingford Park, where the children had a picnic lunch and played frisbee golf. Games and activities at the Edgar Centre followed by a visit to Toitu Museum took place on another day, and then two highlights have been an overnight stay on Quarantine Island, and white water rafting down the Taieri River.



Our Year 4 Students 'Fun Day' included traveling by boat over to the Portobello Aquarium, then later by bus up to visit Larnach Castle. A sleepover was held in the School Hall that night, and the next day was a 'Pyjama Day' at school! An awesome two days, but some very tired faces went home at the end!



Our first 'House' Sports Day was held and it was a great success! Dunrobin, Mathieson, Larnach and Belford are our House names, and children dressed with a 'touch' of their house colour for the occasion.



A Chinese Immersion Day was organised by our Mandarin Enrichment Group. The full school participated with these students and learnt about some different parts of Chinese culture.



Our Technology Enrichment Group submitted their 'Chill-Out Space' project and accompanying design work into the Transpower Engineering Awards. They received a Merit Award for this with prize money of \$750 to the school.


We hope you have enjoyed reading about our students activities and achievements this term.
