Board of Trustees Update

Kia ora koutou. A warm welcome to the beginning of the 2019 school year, and we hope all of your children have settled well into their new classrooms.

School Playground: We are really pleased with the new additions to our school playground and it is great to see that it is being well-used by our children! We would like to sincerely thank everyone in our school and wider community who made this possible, and also to key sponsors: Grant's Braes PTA, the Lion Foundation, Alexander McMillan Trust and the Otago Community Trust. There are still a few finishing touches to be made such as a sand-pit and raised garden beds, and we anticipate these will be coming soon.

School Picnic: As has appeared in the school newsletter in recent weeks, we would like to extend an invitation to all of our children and whānau to join our School Picnic this Sunday, starting at 11.30am. This date is special as it is also Te rā o ngā tamariki / Children's Day, in New Zealand (celebrated on the first Sunday in March) - we look forward to seeing you, and to celebrate our children and their important place in our community and society. We will provide sausages and bread, and please feel free to bring your own food, non-alcoholic drinks, picnic rugs, scooters etc, and enjoy some time in our new playground!

SunSmart School: SunSmart accreditation was recently awarded to our school by the Cancer Society. This means our School has reached the highest standard of sun protection for pupils and staff, and we join five other Dunedin schools (Fairfield, Andersons Bay, Silverstream, Portobello and Balaclava) in becoming SunSmart over the last 5 months. We also receive a free native tree to plant at school.

2019 School Charter: We have had two board meetings in the last few weeks, and the focus of these has been mainly to draft and refine our School Charter which includes our four year strategic plan. Thank you to Gareth, his management team and staff for all of the work that has gone into developing this, and to Michelle Kardos for lending her design skills to our front cover (a one-page summary of our Charter). SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS 2019

The total amount requested from families for 2019 is the same as previous years (\$200 per child, with a \$10 reduction per additional sibling). The total amount is notated as a "donation" and will cover swimming, school trips, visiting performers, and also assistance towards the many aspects that make our school 'tick', all of which provide such a great learning environment for the children. For children attending camps, we will be requesting a contribution and therefore this is also notated as a "donation".

The good news for families is that upon receiving a receipt for payment, you are now be able to claim <u>one third of this donation</u> back in tax, therefore receiving approx \$66 back from IRD, per child.

We appreciate payment of these contributions; however do realize this is a large amount for some families to pay in one lump sum. Therefore, we are happy for automatic payments for smaller, more manageable regular amounts to be set up and receipts duly provided.


