SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS 2019


To comply with new financial recommendations, this year there has been a change to how we request families to contribute to our school.

The Board agreed to keep the total amount requested from families the same as previous years (\$200 per child, with a \$10 reduction per additional sibling). The total amount will be notated as a "donation" and will cover swimming, school trips, visiting performers, and also assistance towards

the many aspects that make our school 'tick', all of which provide such a great learning environment for the children. We will also be requesting contributions towards camps.



The good news for families is that upon receiving a receipt for payment, you will now be able to claim one third of this donation back in tax, therefore receiving approx \$66 back from IRD, per child.


Cost - \$6 per athlete
