Three teams represented Grant's Braes School at the Extra Spelling Quiz on Wednesday afternoon. They were competing against 45 other teams from throughout Dunedin. They had 10 rounds of questions doing different things such as spelling hard words, guessing word origins and dictionary skills. All three teams placed in the top 16 which was a fantastic result.



In Rata & Kowhai as part of our STEAM learning we introduced the children to Botleys. Botleys are a coding robot where the children can create an algorithm to tell the robot what to do. Our task was to get it across the river (a grid) in an interesting and creative way. There was some great problem solving as we discovered bugs in our algorithms. It was lots of fun! They are also very clever and can follow a black line. We had fun putting together the black line puzzle pieces to test how clever the robot is. We also revisited other activities such Code spark, the coding mice and unplugged activities.



The **Annual Book Fair** is coming to our school again next week. A Scholastic Book Fair is a reading event that provides the books kids want to read. It's a wonderful selection of engaging and affordable books for every reading level.

Reading for pleasure, inside and outside of school, has real and long-lasting benefits. It unlocks the power of information and imagination and helps children discover who they are.

Classes will all be given the opportunity to come and visit early in the week to view the books, posters and stationary. From the sales, our school earns a percentage to go back on buying books from the Fair for our library so this is a real 'win-win' situation.

The Book Fair will be open next Monday 17 June through to Thursday 20 June from 8.30am-9.00am, and then from 3.00pm-3.30pm. There will be a late night on Wednesday night, 19 June through until 6.00pm.

Payment for the items from the Book Fair can be either **cash, cheque or EFTPOS**, and Scholastic also provide a credit card machine, so Visa or MasterCard is also accepted.

HEALTH ISSUES

* There has been notification of **'Hand Foot and Mouth Disease** ' within our school. This disease is a mild, infectious viral illness that most frequently occurs in young children. Symptoms include fluid-filled blisters that appear on the hands, feet and inside of the mouth, which makes diagnosis relatively straight-forward. No specific medical treatment is required as Hand Foot and Mouth Disease is usually short-lasting. Paracetamol is recommended to help relieve symptoms. Children should be kept home from school while the blisters in their mouth and on their hands and feet are present.

* **Headlice** has also again been notified and we would ask that parents regularly check, and treat their children's hair if signs of eggs, or live lice are found. Please do not send your child to school until they have been treated appropriate. It is also important for children with longer hair to tie their hair back as this is known to reduce the likelihood of lice being passed on.
