Coloring Competitions are available from the office if your child wishes to participate. They must be taken to the Brick Show on either 5th/6th October to be eligible to enter.





Fair Favourite Recipe No. 2 - Russian Fudge

Ingredients

 $\begin{array}{lll} \mbox{3c sugar} & \mbox{1/2c milk} \\ \mbox{1/2 tin sweetened condensed milk} & \mbox{125g butter} \\ \mbox{Pinch salt} & \mbox{1T golden syrup} \end{array}$

2t vanilla essence



Directions

Gently heat sugar and milk, stirring until sugar has dissolved.

Add the rest of the ingredients and stir until butter has melted.

Bring to the boil and continue to boil until the mixture reaches a soft ball stage (stir occasionally to prevent burning – this stage may take 10-15 minutes).

Remove from heat and cool slightly before beating with an electric beater for about 5 minutes or until the mixture is thick and has lost its gloss. Pour into baking paper lined tin and slice into squares when cold.
