

# **Board of Trustees Update**

Kia ora koutou.

It has been a busy few months since the board elections in June, and we would like to welcome Amie Curtis to the team who has been co-opted to the board. Amie has a background in education and is currently the Kaitoko at the Ōtākōu Runaka and we will value her expertise and contribution. Our other board members include Gareth Taylor (principal), Rachel Brown, Trudie Evans, Paul Stevenson, Nicola Wall and Desiree Wispinski (teacher representative), with secretarial support from Gaylene O'Brien. We thank all parents and caregivers who nominated for election and are grateful to see such interest and support from our wider community, particularly as some schools have difficulty filling board vacancies.

### **Curriculum reports**

At our board meeting in August we reviewed the mid-year interim student achievement report and a number of curriculum reports including those relating to the Ngā Manu (senior school) social sciences inquiry and intervention programmes for children with targeted needs. As outlined in our Annual Plan one of our objectives for 2019 is to ensure that all students progress at their highest levels of educational engagement. A specific outcome related to this, is to increase student engagement and achievement in maths by 5%. As compared to 2018, our mid-year data showed improvements for all children overall and for our target groups of Māori and girls. We hope this progress will be sustained and reflected in our end-of-year reporting. 

# Is your child aged between 6 and 12 and you are interested in contributing to research in psychology?

### Fair Favourite Recipe No. 3 - Coconut Ice

#### Ingredients

3c icing sugar ½c milk 25g butter ¼t salt ¾c coconut Few drops of red food colouring



#### **Directions**

Gently heat icing sugar, milk, butter and salt, stirring until sugar has dissolved.

Boil until the mixture reaches a soft ball stage (do not stir), then add coconut.

Remove from heat and cool for 10 minutes. Add a few drops of food colouring and beat until the mixture starts to thicken. Pour into buttered or baking paper-lined tin.

Beat the white portion until the mixture starts to thicken. Spread this on top of the pink mixture. Slice into squares when cool.
