## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

#### Kia ora koutou

The road safety redevelopment in Belford Street and Mathieson Street is nearing completion and it is exciting that we are now able to utilise the new raised platforms. The road crossing patrol are now situated at the two red raised platforms with myself and a student opening and closing these crossings. It is important for all of the people using the crossing to know that we are unable to open the crossing if there are any cars visibly driving up or down Belford and Mathieson Streets. We currently do not have the ability to stop the traffic at this time, but will keep you all updated on this. It is important that parents and caregivers use good role modelling and use these crossings everytime they cross these roads at this intersection. I am very thankful to the DCC and Fulton Hogan workers for this new layout as I do believe this intersection is now a much safer area.

Kelly Sports will be working within the school this year to run a Health and P.E. professional development programme where experts support teachers and work alongside them to deliver their Health and P.E. programmes. We have been lucky to secure funding from Kiwisport and the Lion Foundation to cover the costs for this and I would like to formally thank them for this.
