## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

#### Kia ora koutou

I would like to welcome you all to the third term! I hope you were able to have some whānau time during the break and it is lovely to see the students back and engaged with their learning. STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) learning will be featuring largely this term with students using their imagination and creativity to be designers and engineers to build their submission to the Dunedin 2040 project. Prior to the public exhibition, we will be holding an Open Afternoon on Monday 24 August so that Whānau come and see the wonderful designs with the children having the opportunity to share their ideas. Yesterday, swimming commenced for the Year 4-6 students. Unfortunately the Annual Sports Interchange has been cancelled as Palmerston Primary School are unable to be involved this year; however we will be having competitors running in the Ariki Cross Country. We also have students involved in the O'Mathalon, Current Events Quiz and a Chess Tournament which will put their brains to the test! This will prove to be a very busy but exciting term! 


Play is an important activity for children and DCC's role is to provide high quality outdoor space where children have fun and develop physical and social skills.
