#### WHEN YOUR CHILD IS UNWELL.....

Already there have been some tummy bugs, and sore throats about! Please keep your child at home when they are unwell for two reasons - firstly, they do not learn or focus well when they are feeling 'under par', and secondly, to avoid bugs being spread to both our staff and other class members. And in this COVID Level 2 environment, this is especially important.

If your child has been vomiting or had diarrhea, it is important that they are kept away from school for <u>at least 48 hours from the last</u> <u>event!</u>

Our school has a 24 hour answer phone so please ring and leave a message to let us know if your child is not coming to school, or send an email to the office and to the class teacher.

### Walk'n'Wheels Week - Challenge Card

All children received a Challenge Card which is being ticked or stamped each day for walking to and from school (one stamp or tick for each way). At the end of the week, children who walk or wheel a <u>minimum of three times can enter</u> via the following form (cut and paste into your browser):

or via the QR code by Friday 19 March 2021. <u>Parents - this requires you to enter your child; the school does not</u> <u>do this for you. Doing this will put your child in the draw to win!</u> There will be a maximum of ten ticks and a minimum or three ticks on their card and this includes walking to and from school. Then children are free to keep their challenge card, they do not need to be returned to school as in previous years.

Children <u>do not need to walk</u> the whole week to enter the draw however, the more times they walk or wheel the more chances they have of winning a great spot prize.

Walked between three to five times - one entry

Walked between six and eight times - two entries

Walked between nine and ten times - four entries



There is also a good chance of our school winning a prize in the form of a voucher from Stirling Sports. The more children we have walking and wheeling, the greater the chance of us winning a prize!
