lātā's visit to museum last week

Last week, the Te Ngahere Syndicate visited the Otago Museum to participate in the Pacific Explores programme. The children followed in the footsteps of the early Polynesian explorers who made Aotearoa their home. The children were able to learn about the key characteristics that explorers would need to be successful. They worked in small groups, taking the role of Pacific explorers about to leave on their journey to Aotearoa. The children were given a basket of items and challenged to select some that they believed would be needed on their journey to Aotearoa. In the $T\bar{a}ngata$ Whenua gallery, the children were able to compare the differences in the climate and landscape of Aotearoa compared to the Pacific Islands. In groups the children explored the gallery to find new resources that they would rely on for their survival in the new land. These photos are of the Rātā children from their visit.

The ski trip this year is being held on Sat 18/Sun 19 September, and you are able to ski either, or both days! You will need to be at Cardrona at 7.30am on the day/s you are skiing to arrange lift passes/equipment etc. The rates are the same for both children and parents -

- Single Day Package (Lift pass, lesson & rental equipment) - \$100
- Single Day Lift & Lesson \$75

Forms for completion are available from the office, and time is tight for confirmation with Cardrona, so these need to be returned, along with full payment, by next Friday 13 August. If the weather is such that you are unable to ski on the day/s you have chosen, then your money will be refunded.
