They started at Megazone, playing mini golf and laser tag. Then travelled to the Ice Skating rink where they had a pizza lunch then time on the ice skating rink. The Year 6 students were incredible and so well mannered! I would like to thank Mr Howell and Mrs Barrow for their organisation of this.

The Year 0 - 3 swimming instruction started yesterday at the Anderson's Bay School pool run by Joy Clark Swim School. This runs until Friday 10 December. I would like to thank all of the parent helpers and our staff for their organisation of this important programme.

School has been given the advice from the Ministry of Education to not implement the new COVID-19 Implementation Plan until 2022, instead keep operating under the school's Alert Level 2 protocols. The exception of this is the vaccine mandate where any parents/caregivers who will be working with students directly, or helping with school activities and trips, need to be vaccination (at least one vaccination) and provide me with evidence of this. Thank you to all that have completed the survey that was emailed out to you all recently.

Intermediate Hall on Tuesday 14 December. A decision has been made to run the assembly programme as normally as possible but it will only involve the Year 6 students and two members of their whānau. Attendees will need to sign in using the Covid Tracing App, maintain physical distance, wear a mask throughout the assembly and have at least one vaccination with evidence provided. The students will be bussed down to Tahuna Intermediate and the assembly will commence at 11am. The ceremony will also be live streamed for those who are unable to attend in person with the limitations of numbers. Further information will be emailed out to the Year 6 families early next week.

Last Day of Term - Tuesday 14 December

The last day of the school year is Tuesday 14 December. All Year 0 - 5 students will need to be picked up from Grants Braes School at 12:30 pm. The Year 6 students will need to be picked up from Tahuna Intermediate at the conclusion of their Leavers' Assembly, which will be approximately 12 pm.

On Friday 10 December you will be receiving your child's end of year report. If there is anything you wish to discuss within this, please contact your child's teacher. Within the envelope there will also be a notice stating which class your child has been placed in for 2022. Please be aware a lot of consideration has been put into this to ensure that their needs, both social and educational are met. Due to the numbers within the year groups, we are required to have a mixture of straight year level and composite classes throughout the school.
