The children had been taught about the history of the moment, which had been inspired by a petition signed by over 30,000 signatures and presented to Parliament in 1972 asking for Te Reo to be taught in schools. # **MESSAGE TO FAMILIES FROM DUNEDIN PUBLIC LIBRARY**

Any library items that were due during alert levels 4 and 3 now have the due date of September 15th. Of course, children and youth (birth up to and including 17 years of age) and Schools with library card(s), do not get library fines. Also, if customers have reserved items ready to collect during alert levels 4 and 3, they will be available to collect up to the 15th of September.

We may need to **limit the number of customers** in the library or bookbus at any one time so people can observe 2 metre physical distancing. Customers 12 years of age or over must wear a face covering, unless they have an exemption. Customers will either need to scan the COVID Tracer App or register their contact details. Library staff will support customers who need help with this process.

Although we can provide most of our usual services, due to the need to social distance, we can't run any events or our regular programmes such as Lego clubs and other kids clubs. The AnyQuestions and Many Answer sites are operating as normal.

Any Questions: https://anyquestions.govt.nz/ is a free NZ National Library service that offers online help to assist New Zealand students with their inquiries. Between 1pm and 6pm weekdays students can log on and chat with a real librarian from New Zealand libraries about their inquiry.Many Answers: https://anyquestions.govt.nz/many answers is available to search 24/7. Here students can search for answers to popular questions asked on AnyQuestions. Many Answers entries are not intended to give students the answer, but to guide them to websites and other resources that will help them find the information themselves.
