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

I hope you all had a lovely long weekend and that you had some special time with friends and family.

COVID-19 Update

As I write this, we currently have six people isolating due to being a close contact, ten isolating due to testing positive for COVID and twenty four people who have returned to school. To date, we have had a total of twenty two positive COVID cases. I will continue to notify whānau of cases within the school by notifying the class and collaborative class, as well as the school community if they have been within the school in the past 48 hours. Please note that I will now only be reporting the number of 'people' who have contracted COVID rather than students or teachers. From tomorrow we will be able to distribute RAT tests to children that become unwell at school and are required to be sent home.

Yesterday morning the Prime Minister announced the changes to the COVID-19 Protection Framework which will take effect from 11:59 pm this Friday 25 March, and to vaccine mandates and My Vaccine Pass, which will take effect from 11:59 pm Monday 4 April. It is important to note that New Zealand still remains at RED, and the GBS Red Level Procedures will continue to be in place, albeit updated with the following aspects when they come into effect. The key changes are as follows:

My Vaccine Pass and vaccination mandates

- The removal of vaccination mandates for education workers will take effect from 11.59 pm Monday 4 April.
- On the same date, removal of the My Vaccine Pass from the COVID-19 Protection Framework (traffic light system).
- There is no requirement to display QR code posters although we will retain these and can be used at your own discretion. This system may need to return if case numbers rise.

COVID-19 PROTECTION FRAMEWORK RED LEVEL

- There is no change to masks in education settings from the existing Red setting
- For all New Zealanders, including in school settings, masks will not be required outdoors.
- Capacity limits will be removed for outdoor events and activities.
- Indoor capacity limits for extra-curricular activities increase to 200 people, or a maximum capacity based on the maximum number of people who could occupy the space if each person was one metre apart (whichever is lower).

I will share the updated GBS RED Protection Framework with all whānau once these have come into effect. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any queries or questions.

The Whānau Leaders decided upon the Tonga Relief Fund as the focus of the donation for last week's "Own Clothes Day" and I am very proud to announce that \$262.20 was raised! Also, a huge thank you to the members of the PTA for organising and running the Pizza/Ice Block lunch last Friday. I would also like to mention that the PTA is still looking to fill the President's role. Being involved in the PTA is a fantastic way to give back to the school and we have a very supportive and hardworking PTA who will give you all the support required.
