

Wow! We have come to the end of the first term and what an interesting term it has been. I would like to thank all of our staff, students and whānau for adhering to the restrictions that were required to be in place. At times this has been difficult, but necessary, and while we have had a number of COVID cases we should all be proud of how we have limited the spread of the virus.

Next term is going to be exciting with a school-wide Arts Creatives programme being implemented, Kapa Haka restarting and the prospect of school trips outside of the classroom. We are also really looking forward to welcoming parents, caregivers and whānau back to our school grounds.

This also marks the end of the summer sports season and I would like to thank all of the parents and caregivers who supported the teams, from coaching, and managing, to cheering from the sideline. Thanks again to Jen Stevenson's sports coordination as well as organisation of the winter sports teams.

COVID-19 Update

As you will all be aware our school moved to COVID Protection Framework Orange Setting as of 12 am this morning resulting in a range of restrictions being lifted. We still recommend the wearing of face masks and will support anyone who wishes to wear these, but they are no longer mandatory for the staff or Year 4 - 6 students. We will also be able to remove the groupings both in the classrooms and also the playground. There are no restrictions on parents and caregivers being onsite and we will be able to restart the Preschool Bears programme. The updated GBS ORANGE Protection Framework will be shared prior to school returning on Monday 2 May, which will contain more details.

As I write this, we currently have nine people isolating due to being a close contact, six people isolating due to testing positive for COVID and to date, sixty-five people who have returned to school. We have had a total of forty-six positive COVID cases.

I attended the PTA Meeting on Monday night and I would like to thank the fantastic parents and caregivers who attended. They have put together a range of wonderful fundraising activities and ideas which will be shared in due course.

Lastly, I would like to wish you all a safe and enjoyable break and I look forward to seeing you all in the new term.

Board of Trustees Update


