From stunning hot weather to strong wintery winds, we get it all! As the days become shorter and cooler, it is timely to talk with your children about road safety and reinforce safe road crossing practices. Unfortunately, I am still getting reports of parents/caregivers parking illegally to pick up or drop off their children before and after school. This is generally on Larnach Road and Belford Street. This puts our student's safety at risk, breaks road rules and inconveniences local residents. Please note that the registration plates numbers of offending vehicles will continue to be provided to the local police for them to follow up on. I would like to thank the majority of our parents/caregivers for adhering to the road rules and ensuring that they are putting the safety of our students first.

COVID-19 Update

As I write this, we currently have eight people isolating due to being a close contact, seven people isolating due to testing positive for COVID and to date fifty-one people who have returned to school. To date, we have had a total of forty positive COVID cases. I will continue to notify whānau of cases within the school by notifying the class and collaborative class, however, I will only be informing the community through this weekly update from this week onwards.

Nature School Dunedin is a one-day programme established in July 2020. Sessions are offered on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays during term time for the school day, for tamariki in Years 4,5, and 6. We are based outside, all year round at various locations, with transport provided. An enrolled child will attend one of these days for a whole term (or a half term block option when offered).







At Nature School we:

Inspire a feeling of joy, curiosity and connectedness with nature.

Offer opportunities for hands-on experiences encompassing different learning styles.

Encourage children to direct their own learning.

Facilitate opportunities for risk-taking, resilience and resourcefulness.

Teach the importance of meaningful interactions and collaboration with peers.

Foster a life-long relationship with conservation values and sustainability.

Engage in unstructured, open-ended imaginative play.

Each day is led by trained primary school teachers, Lizzie Potter and Geoff Markby, both with many years of teaching experience and a passion for the outdoors. Each day is \$75 per child per day.
