I hope you all enjoyed spending time with whānau, sharing kai together and remembering those who have passed, during our first Matariki weekend. This is an incredibly special and important national holiday and I loved how this was embraced throughout the country.

On Monday night, I met with representatives of our Māori whānau and we discussed the development of a Māori Strategic Plan and a school waiata. We also talked about the school visit to the Ōtākou Marae in Week 1, Term 3 and commenced planning for our school Hāngī in Term 4. Discussion also took place in regards to the importance of creating a school-based celebration for Matariki in 2023.

As I've mentioned, the whole school is visiting the Ōtākou Marae in the first week of Term 3 (Year 4-6 Tuesday 26 July, Year 0-3 Thursday 28 July). This is a wonderful opportunity for our tamariki to be immersed in Te Ao Māori. Information in hard copy format was sent home earlier this week and I would like to thank the whānau who have indicated that they would like to be considered in joining with us on the day. We are limited to the number of people that can attend so parent helpers will be put into a ballot and duly notified next week.

School Reports and Interviews

School Reports for all children, except those in Kea, are going home tomorrow. For families who have children currently away for a number of days relating to COVID, we have posted yours so you can expect these in the next few days in your mailbox.

Mid-Year interviews to discuss these Reports are being held next Wednesday 6th July and Thursday 7th July, via Zoom. These interviews between teachers and parents are extremely worthwhile to ensure both the school and parents are working together to obtain the best outcomes for the children. 
MID -YEAR INTERVIEWS Next Wednesday 6th and Thursday 7th July

If you are unable to book on the website, please contact your child's class teacher or the office for assistance in booking the times you require.


