# KINDO - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

## TAX REBATE IN REGARDS TO SCHOOL CONTRIBUTION

With the end of the tax year rapidly approaching, this is a reminder that if your School Contribution is paid by 31st March, you are able to claim 33% rebate (\$66.00) on that after 1 April. Kindo automatically issues you with a receipt if paid via this method.

When you make your donation through 'myKindo', keep an eye out for the option to "amplify your donation" where you can choose to gift this tax rebate back to our school. Even if you don't typically claim rebates, please consider selecting YES. It's a win-win situation. More funding means more resources for our students



## **ONLINE EFTPOS PAYMENT OPTION**

Currently, KINDO are unable to accept Online Eftpos transactions over \$250. This is due to their organisation having received an increase in costs associated with processing higher-value transactions, and KINDO have made the decision not to pass this on to you, their customers. They are actively working with the Online Eftpos business to address this issue and hope this option will be available again soon. Meanwhile, if you do for example wish to pay an amount for your family which is over \$250, please do this in separate transactions, ie for each child individually - top up and then apply the payment. Thank you for your understanding and patience around this.
